## Highlight

The 2020 Free Tire Recycling is currently scheduled in September. Once closer a postcard reminder will be sent out with actual date. As a reminder collection is limited to Town of Liberty Residents only, with a limit of 4 tires per household. Tires from businesses are not accepted. Only tires with a rim size of 18" or less will be accepted at no charge. For all tires with a rim size of 19" or larger in size or quantities of over 4, the resident will be charged \$5.00 per tire at the Town of Liberty Municipal Building.

## Town Topic

I am going to pick a topic each newsletter and discuss briefly. To start we will talk Burning Permits. Currently the Town does not require you to have a burning permit. However, if you do burn please Burn Responsibly...or don't Burn at all! Per the DNR Debris burning is the number one cause of wildfires in Wisconsin. The following are a few tips they offer if you do burn. Pick up a complete list at the Town or download from our website. Keep an eye on the weather and avoid burning under windy conditions, never leave your fire unattended, make sure the burn is completely out before leaving, etc...
