Town Meetings

From the Constable's Corner

Dogs - Tags must be purchased for all dogs in the Town. New or replacement tags can be purchased from Beth Ubl, Town Treasurer at 982-0908. A large portion of our stray pets have tags but the owners have neglected to put them on the animals. Please ensure that your pet is wearing its tag at all times. Do not allow your dog to run at large, habitually bark or howl.

Raft Permits

Raft Permits are required for all rafts on the Wolf and Embarrass River in the Town of Liberty. Permits can be obtained by contacting Levi Lambie at 359-1444.

Town Roads

The large culvert on Lower Road is scheduled for replacement in July or August, 2017. The road will be closed to complete the necessary repairs north of State Highway 54.

Town Cemeteries

Burning Permits

Burning Permits are not required in the Town of Liberty. We do suggest that you contact your local fire department that you are burning. If your burn gets out of control and requires the Fire Department to respond, you will be responsible for all costs.

Meet Your New Recycling Cart

The agreement with Outagamie County to purchase a recycling cart for each household has been completed and implemented. Carts will be available for pickup on **Saturday, May 6, 2017 at the Liberty Town Hall between 8:00 AM and 2:00 PM.**

Since the early '90s, Outagamie County has continued to grow the recycling program. As a result of these efforts, we have outgrown the "Little Blue Bins."

The new 95-gallon carts must be utilized in order for your recyclables to be picked up. The new carts result in easier handling by the refuse haulers. The driver also does not have to leave the vehicle to pick-up the recyclables, resulting in a considerable cost savings.

The cart has two wheels so it is easy to roll to the curb and the lid keeps things tidy. Paper, glass, magazines, newspapers, office paper, corrugated cardboard, aluminum and bi-metal cans and plastic containers (#1 and #2, milk jugs, laundry detergents, soda and water bottles, etc.) can all be placed in the same container for pickup biweekly.

You will receive detailed information regarding accepted items, prohibited items and cart placement when you pick up your container. Additional instructions will also be available on the Town of Liberty website.

Recycling of household hazardous waste can be scheduled by calling 832-5277. Drop off for items such as vehicle fluids, batteries, cleaners, solvents and paint is at 1419 Holland Road, Appleton, WI. An appointment is required.
