# NOTICE OF SPRING ELECTION AND PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE VOTE AND SAMPLE BALLOTS APRIL 7, 2020

## OFFICE OF THE OUTAGAMIE COUNTY CLERK

### TO THE VOTERS OF OUTAGAMIE COUNTY AND PARTS OF CALUMET (VILLAGE OF HARRISON & CITY OF APPLETON) & WINNEBAGO (CITY OF APPLETON) COUNTIES:

(Note: City of New London publishes separately – County information is listed in this Notice.)

Notice is hereby given of a spring election and a Presidential Preference Vote to be held in Outagamie County and parts of Calumet (Village of Harrison & City of Appleton) and Winnebago (City of Appleton) Counties, on Tuesday, April 7, 2020, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office to be voted for, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, for a referendum, if any, in the sample ballot below.

### INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence, if the voter presents proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot, except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

### AT THE SPRING ELECTION

#### Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided, and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an electronic ballot marking device ("ExpressVote" or "ImageCast Evolution-ICE") to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall touch the screen at the name of the candidate of his or her choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

### AT THE PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE VOTE

#### Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

Within the party of his or her choice, the voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of his or her choice or shall, in the alternative, fill in the oval next to the words "Uninstructed Delegation," or write in the name of a person of his or her choice for a candidate in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line.

When using an electronic ballot marking device ("ExpressVote" or "ImageCast Evolution-ICE") to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall touch the screen at the party of his or her choice. Within the party of his or her choice, the voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of his or her choice or shall, in the alternative, touch the screen at the words "Uninstructed Delegation," or type in the name of a person of his or her choice in the space provided for a write-in vote.

#### **A voter may cast only one vote in the presidential preference primary.**

The vote shall not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking his or her ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

If a voter spoils an optical scan ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

#### After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. After casting his or her vote, the voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve. Where a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. After casting his or her vote, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve or deliver it to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

# Voter Registration

## WHEN CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?

**At the polling place on Election Day.** You may register at the polls on Election Day. You must always provide a Proof of Residence document when registering to vote.

## WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

If you have been issued a State of Wisconsin Driver License or ID card that is current and valid, you must provide the number and expiration date. If your WI driver license is cancelled or expired; or your WI DOT-issued ID is expired, provide the number and the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you have not been issued a WI driver license or WI DOT-issued ID, you must provide the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you have none of these documents, you will be able to indicate that fact.

**You must provide a Proof of Residence document** when registering to vote in Wisconsin. A Proof of Residence document is a document that proves where you live in Wisconsin.

## PROOF OF RESIDENCE ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS:

- A current and valid State of Wisconsin Driver License or State ID card.
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
- Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
- A university, college or technical college identification card (must include photo) ONLY if the voter provides a fee receipt dated within the last 9 months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk.
- A gas, electric or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before Election Day.
- A bank or credit card statement.
- A paycheck or paystub.
- A check or other document issued by a unit of government.
- A letter on public or private social service agency letterhead identifying a homeless voter and describing the individual's residence for voting purposes.
- A residential lease that is effective on date of registration. (Not valid if registering by mail.)
- An intake document from a residential care

facility such as a nursing home or assisted living facility.

- All Proof of Residence documents must include the voter's name and current residential address.

*This is not a comprehensive list, but categories of the most common types used by voters.*

## IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT REGISTRATION?

**Voters must reside at their address for at least 10 days by Election Day** in order to register to vote. Voters who have moved within Wisconsin less than 10 days before the election must vote from their previous address, either by absentee ballot or at the polling place. Voters who have moved to Wisconsin from another state less than 10 days before an election are only eligible to vote in Presidential elections.

**Wisconsin law no longer allows a "corroborating witness" to provide Proof of Residence.** See the "Proof of Residence" documents for a list of Proof of Residence documents.

You cannot register the Saturday, Sunday, or Monday before an election, but **you can register at the polling place on Election Day.**

## WISCONSIN NOW REQUIRES A PHOTO ID TO VOTE

### DO I NEED A SPECIAL VOTER ID CARD?

**There is not a separate "Voter ID" card.** There are many forms of photo ID, which you may already have, that can be used to vote. Anyone voting in person must show the original copy of their photo ID.

Anyone with a valid Wisconsin driver license or Wisconsin state ID card, or any of the documents listed below, already has the photo ID they need for voting purposes.

### WHAT CAN I USE AS PHOTO ID TO VOTE?

**The following photo IDs are acceptable for voting purposes, and can be unexpired or expired after, November 6, 2018 (currently the date of the last General Election):**

- A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended.

Your Wisconsin

- DOT-issued driver license does not need to be a "REAL ID".
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card. Your Wisconsin DOT-issued ID card does not need to be a "REAL ID".
- Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services
- A U.S. passport book or card
- The following photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes:
  - A certificate of naturalization (that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of the election)
  - An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin or A driver license receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
  - An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
  - A Wisconsin DMV ID Petition Process Photo Receipt (valid for 180 days from date issued)
  - A Veteran Affairs ID card (must be unexpired or have no expiration date)
  - A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college, or technical college that contains the following:
    - ◇ Date the card was issued
    - ◇ Signature of student
    - ◇ Expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance, can still be used if expired
    - ◇ The university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment, such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter, or class schedule

## WHAT WILL THE POLL WORKER BE LOOKING AT ON MY PHOTO ID?

An acceptable Photo ID for voting does not have to include a current address.

- **Elector's Photograph** - The photograph must reasonably resemble the elector
- **Elector's Name** - The elector's name must conform to the name on their voter registration; conform does not mean that the name must be identical to the name on the voter registration
- **An Expiration** - If the ID has an expiration date, it must meet the expiration requirements listed above

### 2019 ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION 3

To renumber and amend section 9m of article I; and to create section 9m (1) of article I, section 9m

a. of article I, section 9m (5) of article I and section 9m (6) of article I of the constitution; relating to: the rights of crime victims (second consideration).

Whereas, the 2017 legislature in regular session considered a proposed amendment to the constitution in 2017 Senate Joint Resolution 53, which became 2017 Enrolled Joint Resolution 13, and agreed to it by a majority of the members elected to each of the two houses, which proposed amendment reads as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 9m of article I of the constitution is renumbered section 9m. (2) (intro.) of article I and amended to read:

[Article I] Section 9m (2) (intro.) ~~This state shall treat crime victims, as defined by law, with fairness, dignity and respect for their privacy. This state shall ensure that crime victims have all of the following privileges and protections as provided by law: In order to preserve and protect victims' rights to justice and due process throughout the criminal and juvenile justice process, victims shall be entitled to all of the following rights, which shall vest at the time of victimization and be protected by law in a manner no less vigorous than the protections afforded to the accused:~~

- (a) ~~To be treated with dignity, respect, courtesy, sensitivity, and fairness.~~
- (b) ~~To privacy.~~
- (c) ~~To proceedings free from unreasonable delay.~~
- (d) ~~To timely disposition of the case; the opportunity to attend court, free from unreasonable delay.~~
- (e) ~~Upon request, to attend all proceedings unless the trial court finds sequestration is necessary to a fair trial for the defendant; involving the case.~~
- (f) ~~To reasonable protection from the accused throughout the criminal and juvenile justice process;.~~
- (g) ~~Upon request, to reasonable and timely notification of court proceedings; the opportunity to.~~
- (h) ~~Upon request, to confer with the prosecution; the opportunity to make a statement to the court at disposition; attorney for the government.~~
- (i) ~~Upon request, to be heard in any proceeding during which a right of the victim is implicated, including release, plea, sentencing, disposition, parole, revocation, expungement, or pardon.~~
- (j) ~~To have information pertaining to the economic, physical, and psychological effect upon the victim of the offense submitted to the authority with jurisdiction over the case and to have that information considered by that authority.~~
- (k) ~~Upon request, to timely notice of any release or escape of the accused or death of the accused if the accused is in custody or on supervision at the time of death.~~
- (L) ~~To refuse an interview, deposition, or other discovery request made by the accused or any person acting on behalf of the accused.~~
- (m) ~~To full restitution; from any person who has been ordered to pay restitution to the victim and to be provided with assistance collecting restitution.~~
- (n) ~~To compensation; and as provided by law.~~
- (o) ~~Upon request, to reasonable and timely information about the status of the investigation and the outcome of the case and the release of the accused.~~

(p) ~~To timely notice about all rights under this section and all other rights, privileges, or protections of the victim provided by law, including how such rights, privileges, or protections are enforced.~~

(3) ~~Except as provided under sub. (2) (n), all provisions of this section are self-executing. The legislature shall provide may prescribe further remedies for the violation of this section. Nothing in this section, or in any statute enacted pursuant to this section, shall limit any right of the accused which may be provided by law, and further procedures for compliance with and enforcement of this section.~~

**SECTION 2.** Section 9m (1) of article I of the constitution is created to read:

[Article I] Section 9m (1) (a) In this section, notwithstanding any statutory right, privilege, or protection, "victim" means any of the following:

1. A person against whom an act is committed that would constitute a crime if committed by a competent adult.
  2. If the person under subd. 1. is deceased or is physically or emotionally unable to exercise his or her rights under this section, the person's spouse, parent or legal guardian, sibling, child, person who resided with the deceased at the time of death, or other lawful representative.
  3. If the person under subd. 1. is a minor, the person's parent, legal guardian or custodian, or other lawful representative.
  4. If the person under subd. 1. is adjudicated incompetent, the person's legal guardian or other lawful representative.
- (b) "Victim" does not include the accused or a person who the court finds would not act in the best interests of a victim who is deceased, incompetent, a minor, or physically or emotionally unable to exercise his or her rights under this section.

**SECTION 3.** Section 9m (4) of article I of the constitution is created to read:

[Article I] Section 9m (4) (a) In addition to any other available enforcement of rights or remedy for a violation of this section or of other rights, privileges, or protections provided by law, the victim, the victim's attorney or other lawful representative, or the attorney for the government upon request of the victim may assert and seek in any circuit court or before any other authority of competent jurisdiction, enforcement of the rights in this section and any other right, privilege, or protection afforded to the victim by law. The court or other authority with jurisdiction over the case shall act promptly on such a request and afford a remedy for the violation of any right of the victim. The court or other authority with jurisdiction over the case shall clearly state on the record the reasons for any decision regarding the disposition of a victim's right and shall provide those reasons to the victim or the victim's attorney or other lawful representative.

(b) Victims may obtain review of all adverse decisions concerning their rights as victims by courts or other authorities with jurisdiction under par. (a) by filing petitions for supervisory writ in the court of appeals and supreme court.

**SECTION 4.** Section 9m (5) of article I of the constitution is created to read:

[Article I] Section 9m (5) This section does not create any cause of action for damages against the state; any political subdivision of the state; any officer, employee, or agent of the state or a political subdivision of the state acting in his or her official capacity; or any officer, employee, or agent of the courts acting in his or her official capacity.

**SECTION 5.** Section 9m (6) of article I of the constitution is created to read:

[Article I] Section 9m (6) This section is not intended

and may not be interpreted to supersede a defendant's federal constitutional rights or to afford party status in a proceeding to any victim.

**SECTION 6.** Numbering of new provisions. If another constitutional amendment ratified by the people creates the number of any provision created in this joint resolution, the chief of the legislative reference bureau shall determine the sequencing and the numbering of the provisions whose numbers conflict.

**Now, therefore, be it resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That** the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution is agreed to by the 2019 legislature; and, be it further

**Resolved, That** the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be submitted to a vote of the people at the election to be held on the first Tuesday in April 2020; and, be it further

**Resolved, That** the question concerning ratification of the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution be stated on the ballot as follows:

**QUESTION 1: "Additional rights of crime victims.** Shall section 9m of article I of the constitution, which gives certain rights to crime victims, be amended to give crime victims additional rights, to require that the rights of crime victims be protected with equal force to the protections afforded the accused while leaving the federal constitutional rights of the accused intact, and to allow crime victims to enforce their rights in court?"

#### EXPLANATION

The Wisconsin Constitution, article I, section 9m, currently provides that the state shall treat crime victims "with fairness, dignity and respect for their privacy." That provision also mandates that the state ensure that crime victims have certain "privileges and protections" relative to the accused and the criminal case. Separate from these constitutional provisions, chapter 950 of the Wisconsin Statutes provides a "bill of rights" for victims and witnesses of crimes.

The proposed amendment would make five general changes to article I, section 9m, of the Wisconsin Constitution.

First, in 16 subsections, the proposed amendment would expand the rights of victims by creating additional rights and incorporating other statutory rights into the constitution.

Second, the proposed amendment would incorporate into the constitution a definition of "victim" similar to the definition currently in statute.

Third, the proposed amendment would create an additional mechanism by which victims could enforce their rights as victims.

Fourth, the proposed amendment would incorporate into the constitution a limit on governmental liability for any violation of victims' rights, similar to the limit currently provided by statute.

Fifth, the proposed amendment would provide that it may not be interpreted to supersede a defendant's federal constitutional rights or afford party status in a proceeding to any victim.

A "yes" vote on this question would amend the Wisconsin Constitution as summarized above.

A "no" vote on this question would decline to amend the Wisconsin Constitution as summarized above. A "no" vote would not alter existing protections for crime victims.


